ADB in Brief

- Founded in 1966
- Goal is an Asia Pacific free of poverty
- 67 member countries 48 regional, 19 nonregional

- HQ in Manila, 29 resident missions, 3 rep offices
- Provides loans, grants, TA,
 equity, policy dialogue
- In 2017, ADB provided
 \$32B of assistance in total







ADB's Strategy 2030

- Vision: achieve a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific
- Value-addition: trusted development partner, reliable financier and catalyzer, knowledge provider, and convener of partnerships
- 7 Operational Priorities: poverty reduction, gender equality, climate change, livable cities, rural development and food security, governance, and <u>regional cooperation and integration</u>




RCI Operational Plan (2016–2020)

- 3 Operational Directions
 - 1) Strengthening connectivity
 - 2) Raising competitiveness in connected markets: cross-border trade,

investment, technology, finance, labor

- 3) Investing in regional public goods (RPG) and collective action
- Supports 4 Pillars of RCI Strategy (2006)
 - (i) infrastructure, (ii) trade and investment,
 - (iii) money and finance, and (iv) RPG



RCI Platforms in Asia and the Pacific

- Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS)
 - Over \$17 billion invested by ADB since 1992
 - GMS Investment Framework (2013-2022): \$50 billion projects
- Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC)
 - Over \$27 billion invested by ADB in 2001-2015
 - Priority areas: transport, energy, trade facilitation, and trade policy






- South Asia Subregional Economic Cooperation (SASEC)
 - \$7.7 billion funded by ADB since 2001
 - SASEC OP (2016-2025): transport, trade facilitation, energy, and economic corridors
- Pacific Islands Forum (PIF)
 - \$2 billion invested by ADB to date

Sustainable Transport Initiative 2010-2020

- Expand support for ST
- Make transport affordable, accessible, environmentally friendly, and safe
- Scale up:
 - Urban transport
 - Addressing climate change
 - Cross-border transport & logistics
 - Road safety & social sustainability





ADB and Infrastructure Development

- Infrastructure connectivity is the backbone of sustained economic growth, poverty reduction, and economic integration.
- The region's infrastructure remains far from adequate despite rapid improvements.
- Developing Asia's infrastructure needs are large and growing (\$1.7 trillion per year).


ADB's Role in Infrastructure Development

GMS Logistics Action Plan

- From transport corridor to economic corridor
- Under preparation
- Viet Nam–PRC Cross Border Logistics Study in 2017
 - VN–PRC Infrastructure Developments
 - Planned/ongoing RCI programs
 - Close coordination with logistics associations and operators
 - Recommended hard/soft actions
