

# **1** Trade expansion from increased market access

- Support for WTO accession and postaccession commitments
- Implementation of WTO agreements on TFA, SPS and TBT
- Reduction of non-tariff barriers and regulatory alignment with international standards including on SPS systems and quality infrastructure



- Regional improvements of border services (RIBS), regional upgrade on SPS for trade (RUST)
- Deepening initiatives in customs cooperation, best practices in customs procedures, transit, data exchange, mutual recognition
- Use of technology for customs and trade-related transactions, paperless trade, single window



- Capacity-building and dialogue on policy reforms for improved business environment
- Promotion and facilitation for cross-border investments, financial transactions, and schemes to meet financing demands and promote innovation
- SMEs access to trade and supply chain finance and credit insurance



- Policy work to develop key services sectors, improve trade in services e.g., tourism and travel
- Facilitation of movement of workers and traders, collaboration towards skills upgrading and mutual recognition
- Industrial and business development including special economic zones, economic corridors and industrial parks

## **3** Stronger institutions for trade

- Establishment or strengthening of National Committees on Trade Facilitation or similar mechanisms
- Promotion of regulatory convergence and support for trade strategies and roadmap development
- Exchange of information and best practices including through online trade portal, contact points and experts groups



- Strengthening capacities of traderelated officials on policy, regulations and negotiations
- Analytical work and inter-subregional knowledge-sharing on trade agreements
- Enhanced publicprivate sector dialogue and linkage between policy and research work



### **Institutional Structure**



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- SEZs are viewed as viable tool of industrial policy, dovetails into economic corridor development of CAREC countries
- Identifying the pros and cons of SEZs and learning from other countries experience cannot be overemphasized
- Policies that promote clusters and enhance productivity are essential
- SEZs function best in a sound, stable macroeconomic environment, with good governance and policies encouraging spillovers and time-bound incentives
