



## **GREEN FINANCING MECHANISM AND CHALLENGES IN THE CAREC REGION**

### **Online Policy Dialogue**

**2 June 2026, 16:00-18:00 (Beijing time, GMT +8)**

#### **I. Background**

The CAREC region confronts numerous urgent challenges, with climate change standing as the most pressing priority for member states and multilateral development partners alike. Escalating global warming impacts including destabilized livelihoods, degraded ecosystems, and threatened economic security are intensifying climate risks across the region. Central Asia faces particularly acute vulnerabilities, enduring severe environmental pressures such as rising temperatures, accelerating glacier loss, the ongoing disappearance of the Aral Sea, and increasingly frequent extreme weather events including droughts and floods (CAREC, Climate Inaction Report 2024).

Recent analyses by the Asian Development Bank and CAREC Institute underscore the critical need to scale up climate finance mobilization. While growing recognition of climate threats has spurred stronger national commitments and enhanced regional cooperation, fundamental structural barriers remain. These challenges include lack of a systematic approach, the development of a green taxonomy and investment ecosystem, and the lack of coordinating action/regional integration.

Compounding these issues, the region struggles with contentious debates and widely divergent estimates about green investment requirements, particularly in Central Asia where understanding of financing mechanisms and market potential remains limited. Current assessments indicate Central Asia requires approximately \$38 billion annually in sustainable climate finance through 2030 - a stark contrast to the mere \$10 billion in total foreign direct investment recorded in 2022 (UNECE, 2023). This yawning financing gap highlights the indispensable role private capital must play in delivering sustainable infrastructure solutions across the region.

To address these urgent challenges, the CAREC Institute conducted research exploring Green Financing Pathways and Navigating Future Obstacles. This research serves multiple purposes: enhancing capacity building, raising awareness of climate finance solutions, encouraging investments in sustainable development, and attracting vital funding from both local and international sources. Through data-driven analysis and actionable recommendations, the CAREC Institute's research aims to become an essential resource for promoting green growth and strengthening climate resilience across the CAREC region.

#### **II. Key Objectives**

The CAREC Institute's research 'Green Financing Pathways and Navigating Future Obstacles' aims to document and track challenges, opportunities, and feasible models to create a conducive environment for climate finance, focusing on the financial structure and market dynamics of the CAREC region. Based on this research, the policy dialogue will focus on green investment ecosystem to narrow the green investment gaps in core sectors.

The policy dialogue's specific objectives are:

- To provide overview of globally accepted financing tools for green/climate investments, their availability and applicability in the CAREC market.
- To discuss successful case studies on green technologies/investment and their implications for various regional industries.
- To explore the role and impact of PPP in advancing green projects, including key models, success factors, and lessons learned from existing initiatives.
- To examine the role of environmental regulations, initiatives, and institutional support in fostering green investment in the CAREC region.
- To offer an inclusive green investment ecosystem for major industries in the CAREC region.

### **III. Date, Mode, and Target Audience**

**Date:** A half-day policy dialogue is scheduled for 2 June 2026 from 16:00-18:00 Beijing time (GMT +8).

**Languages:** English and Russian with simultaneous interpretation.
